
The Genealogy of Jesus the Messiah

Who was Ruth?

- Moabite from Moab (modern day Jordan)
- "Ruth the Moabite" ~ repeated phrase
- An Immigrant ; foreigner in the land of Judah (Bethlehem)
- One of only two women with a Bible book named after her.



Deuteronomy 25:5-6

⁵ If brothers are living together and one of them dies without a son, his widow must not marry outside the family. Her husband's brother shall take her and marry her and fulfill the duty of a brother-in-law to her. ⁶ The first son she bears shall carry on the name of the dead brother so that his name will not be blotted out from Israel.


Moabite sarcophagus in Jordan Archaeological Museum in Amman



" The Moabites" The destroyer, subduer, or fish-god; Introduced at Jerusalem by Solomon (1 Kings 11:7). Abolished by King Josiah (2 Kings 23:13)

Worship included human sacrifices.

Described by O.T. as "Vile" and "Detestable".



Lot and his two daughters left Zoar and settled in the mountains, for he was afraid to stay in Zoar. He and his two daughters lived in a cave. 31 One day the older daughter said to the younger, "Our father is old, and there is no man around here to give us children--as is the custom all over the earth.

Origin of Moabites Genesis 19:30-37

32 Let's get our father to drink wine and then sleep with him and preserve our family line through our father." 33 That night they got their father to drink wine, and the older daughter went in and slept with him. He was not aware of it when she lay down or when she got up. 34 The next day the older daughter said to the younger, "Last night | slept with my father. Let's get him to drink wine again tonight, and you go in and sleep with him so we can preserve our family line through our father."

Origin of Moabites Genesis 19:30-37

35 So they got their father to drink wine that night also, and the younger daughter went in and slept with him. Again he was not aware of it when she lay down or when she got up. 36 So both of Lot's daughters became pregnant by their father. 37 The older daughter had a son, and she named him Moab; he is the father of the Moabites of today.

Ruth 1:22

So Naomi returned from Moab accompanied by Ruth the Moabite, her daughter-in-law, arriving in Bethlehem as the barley harvest was beginning.

Ruth the Moabite Immigrant SPOILER ALERT! Boaz the Jew marries Ruth the Moabite!! What did God say about His people relating to foreigners? Ezekiel 44:9

This is what the Sovereign LORD says: No foreigner uncircumcised in heart and flesh is to enter my sanctuary, not even the foreigners who live among the [sraelites.

What did God say about His people relating to foreigners? Ezra 10:10-11

Then Ezra the priest stood up and said to them, "You have been unfaithful; you have married foreign women, adding to [srael's guilt. 1 1 Now honor the LORD, the God of your ancestors, and do his will. Separate yourselves from the peoples around you and from your foreign wives."

What did God say about His people relating to foreigners? Exodus 34:15-16

Be careful not to make a treaty with those who live in the land; for when they prostitute themselves to their gods and sacrifice to them, they will invite you and you will eat their sacrifices. I 6 And when you choose some of their daughters as wives for your sons and those daughters prostitute themselves to their gods, they will lead your sons to do the same.

What was different about Ruth? Ruth 2:8-12

So Boaz said to Ruth, "My daughter, listen to me. Don't go and glean in another field and don't go away from here. Stay here with the women who work for me. 9 Watch the field where the men are harvesting, and follow along after the women. I have told the men not to lay a hand on you. And whenever you are thirsty, go and get a drink from the water jars the men have filled."

What was different about Ruth? Ruth 2:8-12

11 Boaz replied, "I've been told all about what you have done for your mother-in-law since the death of your husband--how you left your father and mother and your homeland and came to live with a people you did not know before. 12 May the LORD repay you for what you have done. May you be richly rewarded by the LORD, the God of Israel, under whose wings you have come to take refuge."

What was different about Ruth? Ruth 1:16

But Ruth replied [to Naomi], "Don't urge me to leave you or to turn back from you. Where you go | will go, and where you stay | will stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God.

What was different about Ruth? Contrast with Orpah Ruth 1:14

Then Orpah kissed her mother-inlaw goodbye, but Ruth clung to her.

Why was Boaz kind to Ruth? Reason #1: He knew God's Word Levítícus 19:33-34

"When a foreigner resides among you in your land, do not mistreat them. The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt. Lam the LORD your God."

Why was Boaz kind to Ruth? Reason #1: He knew God's Word Levítícus 19:9-10

When you reap the harvest of your land, do not reap to the very edges of your field or gather the gleanings of your harvest. 10 Do not go over your vineyard a second time or pick up the grapes that have fallen. Leave them for the poor and the foreigner.] am the LORD your God.

What does it mean to be an Immigrant?

Immigration is the international movement of people to a destination country of which they are not natives or where they do not possess citizenship in order to settle or reside there, especially as permanent residents or naturalized citizens.




What does it mean to be a Refugee?

A refugee is a person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, persecution, or natural disaster. (Example: Naomi)

The Genealogy of Jesus the Messíah Ruth 4:13-17

So Boaz took Ruth and she became his wife. When he made love to her, the LORD enabled her to conceive, and she gave birth to a son. 14 The women said to Naomi: "Praise be to the LORD, who this day has not left you without a kinsman-redeemer. May he become famous throughout Israel! 15 He will renew your life and sustain you in your old age.

The Genealogy of Jesus the Messiah Ruth 4:13-17

For your daughter-in-law, who loves you and who is better to you than seven sons, has given him birth." 16 Then Naomi took the child in her arms and cared for him. 17 The women living there said, "Naomi has a son!" And they named him Obed. He was the father of Jesse, the father of David.
