






Ruth 1:3-7 "Naomi's husband Elimelech died, and she was left with her two sons. Her sons took Moabite women as their wives: one was named Orpah and the second was named Ruth. After they lived in Moab about 10 years, both Mahlon and Chilion also died, and Naomi was left without her two children and without her






"She arose & left the place where she had been living, accompanied by her two daughters-in-law, and traveled along the road leading back to the land of Judah."



Ruth 1 "levirate marriage" Deuteronomy 25:5-6 ⁵ If brothers are living together and one of them dies without a son, his widow must not marry outside the family. Her husband's brother shall take her and marry her and fulfill the duty of a brother-in-law to her. ⁶ The first son she bears shall carry on the name of the dead brother so that his name will not be blotted out from Israel.




