
































How often do we fashion idols in our own image and "breath life into them?"

"If, standing before the heart-searching God at this time, you cannot say,

'It is true,'

Do not talk about baptism or the Lord's Supper, nor of joining a church, nor of being a Christian; for if you do, you will lie against your own soul. If it be not true that you renounce the world's idols, do not profess that it is so.

(Spurgeon)

"If, standing before the heart-searching God at this time, you cannot say,

'It is true,'

It is unnecessary that a man should profess to be what he is not; it is a sin of (going overboard), a superfluity of naughtiness. If you cannot be true to Christ, if your coward heart is (unfaithful) to your Lord, do not profess to be his disciple, I beseech you. He that is married to the world, or (hard-hearted), had better return to his house, for he is of no service in this war."
