



Genesis 27:22-35

22 Jacob went close to his father Isaac, who touched him and said, "The voice is the voice of Jacob, but the hands are the hands of Esau." 23 He did not recognize him, for his hands were hairy like those of his brother Esau; so he proceeded to bless him. 24

"Are you really my son Esau?" he asked.

"I am," he replied.

25 Then he said, "My son, bring me some of your game to eat, so that I may give you my blessing." Jacob brought it to him and he ate; and he brought some wine and he drank.

26 Then his father Isaac said to him, "Come here, my son, and kiss me."

27 So he went to him and kissed him. When Isaac caught the smell of his clothes, he blessed him and said,

"Ah, the smell of my son is like the smell of a field that the Lord has blessed.

"My father, please sit up and eat some of my game, so that you may give me your blessing."

32 His father Isaac asked him, "Who are you?" "I am your son," he answered, "your firstborn, Esau."

33 Isaac trembled violently and said, "Who was it, then, that hunted game and brought it to me? I ate it just before you came and I blessed him—and indeed he will be blessed!"

34 When Esau heard his father's words, he burst out with a loud

29 May nations serve you and peoples bow down to you. Be lord over your brothers, and may the sons of your mother bow down to you.

May those who curse you be cursed and those who bless you be blessed."

30 After Isaac finished blessing him, and Jacob had scarcely left his father's presence, his brother Esau came in from hunting. 31 He too prepared some tasty food and brought it to his father. Then he said to him,

and bitter cry and said to his father, "Bless me—me too, my father!"

35 But he said, "Your brother came deceitfully and took your blessing."

"There are no (real) role models in Genesis 26-27!"*

- Esau, the man of the field (<u>Gen. 25:27</u>), sets his mind entirely on the things of this world from the beginning by taking two Canaanite wives.
- Isaac, whose own father explicitly forbade him from taking Canaanite wives (<u>Gen. 24:3</u>), nevertheless sets his mind and heart on giving the patriarchal blessing to Esau in exchange for some food—the exact same price for which Esau sold his birthright to Jacob (Gen. 25:29–34).

Further... impartation of the blessing is connected to satisfying his "appetite" (27:4)

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- Rebekah, who was so industriously servanthearted in the days of her youth (Gen. 24:15–20), now industriously orchestrates a plan to deceive her blind husband in order to steal the blessing for Jacob.
- Jacob, initially protests his mother's plan out of a concern for getting caught, but he becomes altogether blameworthy when he carries out the deception that his mother proposes.

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Genesis 25:21-22 -

21 Isaac prayed to the Lord on behalf of his wife, because she was childless. The Lord answered his prayer, and his wife Rebekah became pregnant. 22 The babies jostled each other within her, and she said, "Why is this happening to me?" So she went to inquire of the Lord.

Genesis 25:23 -

And the Lord said to her, "Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples from within you shall be divided; the one shall be stronger than the other, the older shall serve the younger."

- Their deception is successful; Jacob gets the blessing.
- Later we will learn that Isaac cannot give a similar blessing to Esau and instead prophesies that he will serve his brother.

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This isn't right! This isn't justice! What's happening? Why does God allow this to happen?

Where is God in all this...?

Esau's baseness, lack of merit. Isaac's cravings & "appetite" Rebekah's treachery Jacob's deceptiveness

Where is God in all this...?

At work!

Through man's choices (good or evil)

Behind the scenes to bring about the fulfillment of his original birth oracle.

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Not the only time!

Genesis 32:22-26

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²² That night Jacob got up and took his two wives, his two female servants and his eleven sons and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³ After he had sent them across the stream, he sent over all his possessions. ²⁴ So Jacob was left alone, and a man wrestled with him till daybreak. ²⁵ When the man saw that he could not overpower him, he touched the socket of Jacob's hip so that his hip was wrenched as he wrestled with the man. ²⁶ Then the man said,

"Let me go, for it is daybreak."

But Jacob replied,

"I will not let you go until you bless me."

Despite early indications of <u>Jacob's</u> trickery and of <u>Esau</u> as the victim, there is an undercurrent throughout indicating opposite character flaws...

<u>Esau</u>...


Quick to sell his enduring birthright for a temporary meal (v29-34)
